Aglaonema plants are among the best plants for air purification.



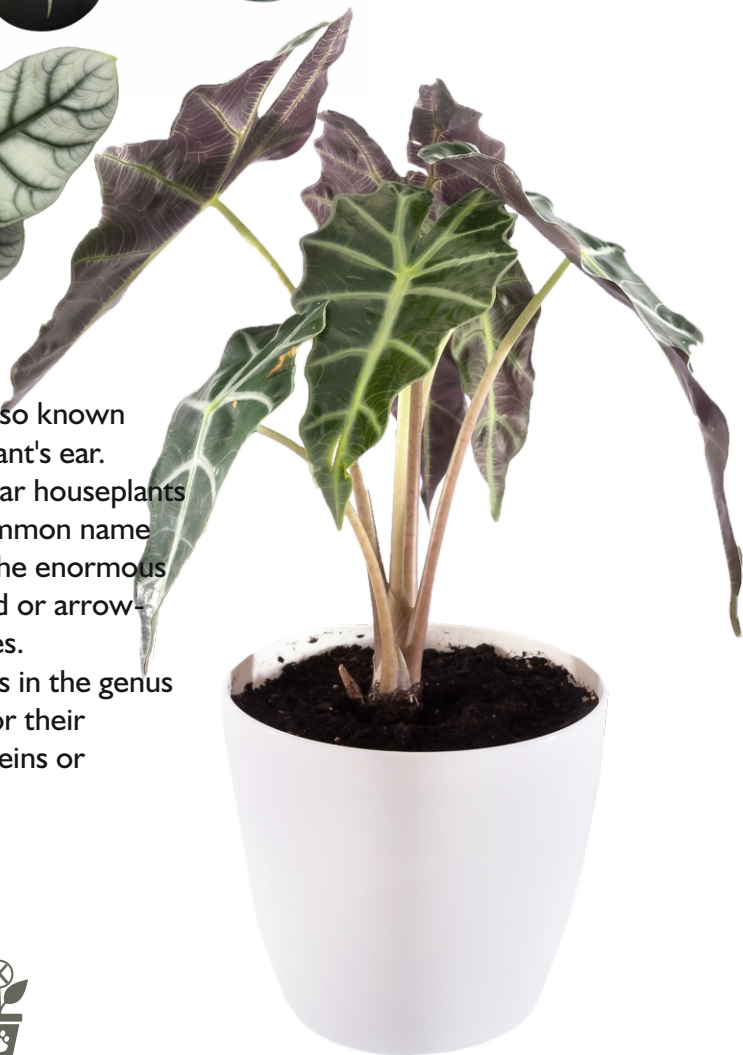

Alocasia is also known as the elephant's ear. These popular houseplants get their common name because of the enormous heart-shaped or arrow-shaped leaves. Many species in the genus are prized for their prominent veins or variegation.

Bird's-nest ferns are known for its shape and distinctive glossy bright leaves. It is an evergreen plant, with solid, undivided fronds that may be a consistent width from top to bottom or taper, depending on the species.



Beaucarnea recurvata

Ponytail palm

A 'ponytail palm' is also known as an 'elephant's foot', a 'ponytail plant' and a 'ponytail palm tree', and despite its common name, it is not technically a species of palm.

This succulent is often mistakenly called a palm because of its single trunk with leaves at the top.



Begonia

Some varieties of Begonia houseplants are grown for their flowers while others are grown for their striking foliage. Leaves can be hairy, fuzzy, or smooth, and are flecked with colorful patterns.



Bonsais

Bonsai or 'tray planting', is the Japanese and East Asian art of growing and training miniature trees in containers.

Trees and plants grown in containers in such a way so that they look their most beautiful – even prettier than those growing in the wild.

Cultivating bonsai, therefore, is a very artistic hobby as well as a traditional Japanese art.

All Calatheas, are humidity lovers, water regularly to keep soils moist during the growing season.

Calathea can be sensitive to water.



Callisia repens

Creeping inch plant, Turtle vine, Purple lady plant

When grown in pots, they make excellent ornamental plants.

Chlorophytum comocsum

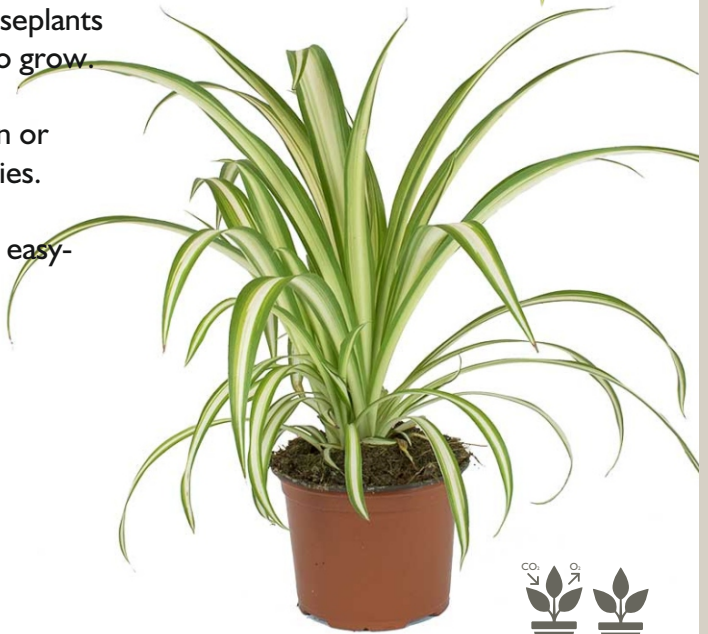
Spider plant, Ribbon plant

Crotons are popular house shrub plant grown and valued for their striking foliage. Easily grown as an indoor houseplant or outdoor accent plant.

The garden crotons should not be confused with Croton. The several hundred cultivars are selected and bred for their foliage.

Curio rowleyanus is commonly cultivated as an ornamental plant. It is typically displayed in hanging baskets with the leaves cascading over the edge of the container.

Dischidia are closely aligned with the sister genus Hoya. Unlike Hoya, the genus Dischidia is poorly known and has not been studied as closely.



Dracaena varieties

Dracaena

They come in many shapes, heights and varieties.
Dracaenas are usually tough, carefree houseplants.

Some common Dracaena varieties are

Dracaena sanderiana

Lucky bamboo

Dracaena sanderiana is an eye catching plant grows easily in water and the canes of the plant have a similar appearance to real bamboo stalks, it has no true connection with Japanese culture.



Dracaena trifasciata

Snake plant, Mother in law's tongue

Up until 2017, it was botanically classified as *Sansevieria trifasciata*. The plant features stiff, sword-like leaves and can range anywhere from six inches to eight feet tall.

Snake plants can vary in colour although many have green-banded leaves and commonly feature a yellow border.

These plants are easy to grow and, in many cases, are nearly indestructible.



Dypsis lutescens

Areca palm, Golden cane palm, Butterfly palm

One of several common names, "butterfly palm" refers to the leaves which curve upwards in multiple stems that look similar to a butterfly.

It has been shown to reduce indoor air pollution and is one of the most popular indoor palms.

Delightful little succulents that make attractive small houseplants. A common Howarthia is characterized by its rosette-shaped, tightly packed leafy clusters.



Some are firm, tough, and dark green, whereas other species are softer and even translucent. Those of the firm, dark green variety are typically dotted with white spots and can turn a rich hue of purple-red when exposed to full sun.

Monstera

Monstera deliciosa differs and is hugely popular than the from the *Monstera adansonii*.

Although not a philodendron, this plant is commonly called split-leaf philodendron.

Comes in many sizes- be small or bold or on a moss stick.



Pachira aquatica

Money tree, Malabar chestnut, Saba nut



The 'braided bark' variety are very popular and sought after. Taller trees look stunning as a 'specimen' plant in a corner of a room/office. Many sizes are available.



Peperomia varieties

Peperomia obtusifolia, Peperomia rotundifolia, Peperomia polybotrya, Peperomia caperata, Peperomia albovittata, and more....



Peperomia plants are grown for their beautiful foliage, not their blooms.

Peperomias are old favorites that have gone in and out of fashion for decades, and they are enjoying a surge of attention. It's a beautiful, diverse family that is wonderful to collect.



Philodendron birkin

Birkin



Perfect houseplant! They are compact, and relatively easy to care for.

Birkins are identified by their round, deep green leaves with mildly pointed tips and vivid white in-stripes and variegation.

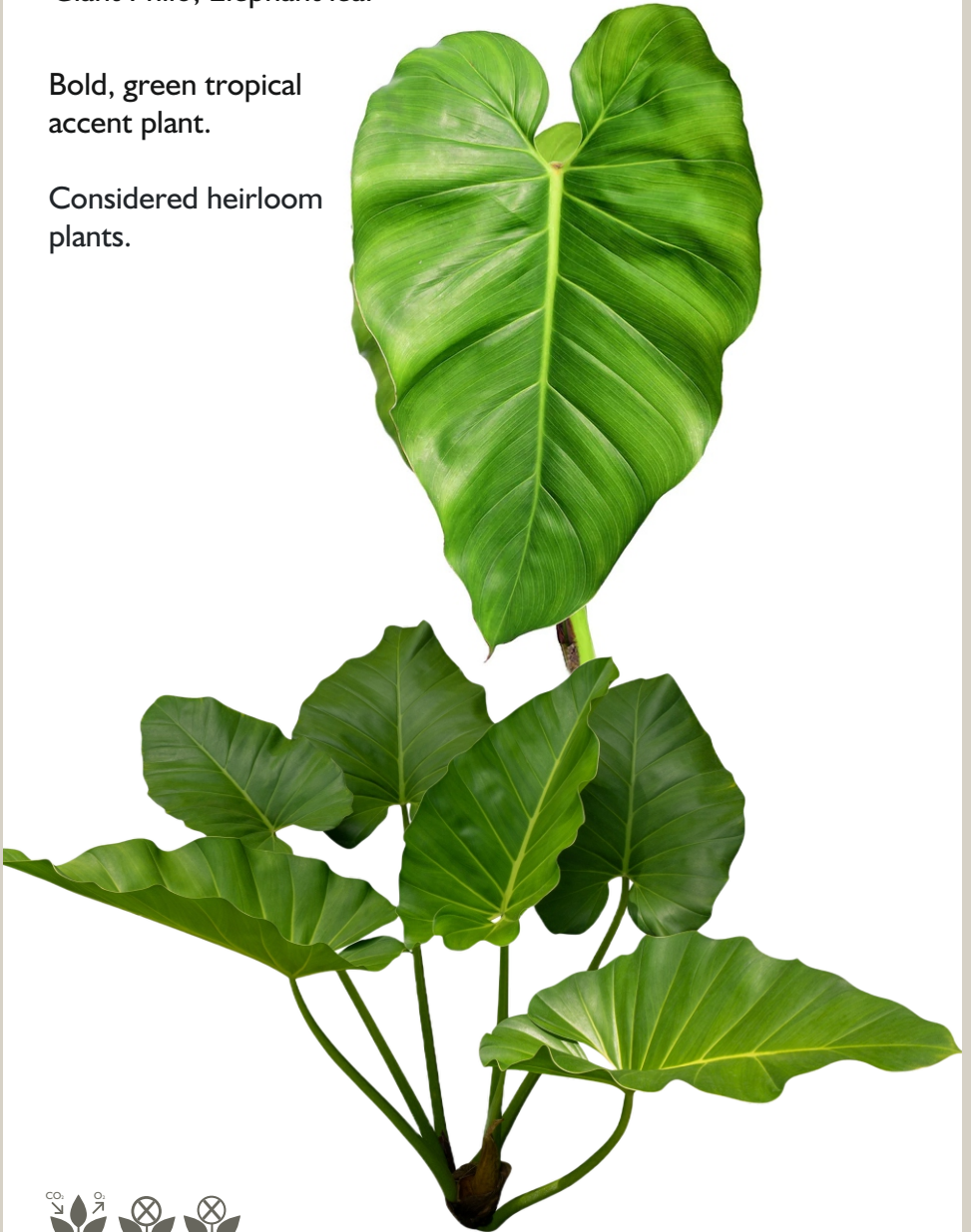


Philodendron giganteum

There are two types of philodendrons to choose from: vining and non-climbing.

Rademachera sinica

China doll, Serpent tree

China Doll Plant with lush green leaves, full of vigor and vitality, can be used as a thriving plant, bringing happiness to people.

Recent dwarf variations have been released, often referred to as the Asian Bell Tree.



Raphis excelsa

Bamboo palm, Lady palm



There are several varieties of the *Raphis excelsa* available.



Saribus rotundifolium

Fan palm, Hand palm



Formally known as the *Livistona rotundifolium* may not be the largest inner palm, but it is the most graceful of all.

The large fan-shaped leaves make this plant one of the most elegant of its kind.

New leaves are constantly being produced from the heart.

Schefflera arboricola

Dwarf umbrella

Popular cultivars include 'Dazzle', a variegated form with nearly white leaves; 'Gold Capella', a yellow and green variegated form; 'Trinette', a white and cream variegated plant; and 'Dwarf', which has dark green leaves.



The larger **Schefflera actinophylla** features long, shiny, oval green leaves that droop gracefully from a central stalk, resembling an umbrella.

Schefflera arboricola (sometimes called dwarf Schefflera) features smaller, glossy leaves, sometimes with creamy variegation. Other than the smaller size, it looks very similar to its taller cousin.

Scindapsus

Satin pothos, Money plant



Scindapsus is not easily distinguishable from

Epipremnum

Satin pothos (Scindapsus pictus), just like its botanical cousin pothos (Epipremnum aureum) is one of the easiest houseplants to grow

Both are members of the Arum family



Many varieties are available in India: 'Marble queen', "Marble princess" and "Neon" to name a few.....



Spathiphyllum wallisii

Peace lily, White sails, Spathe flower

Calm, tropical, beautiful houseplant - understated and simple.

Although it is called a "lily", the peace lily is not a true lily from the family Liliaceae.



Strelizia nicoli

Bird of paradise (indoor)

Its large banana plant-like leaves grown from its clumping stalks are loved.

Rarely produces flowers indoors.



Syngonium podophyllum

Arrowhead plant

Arrowhead vines, as the name implies, want to spread out and extended in all directions.

There are some varieties stay more compact, but others will spread it's wings and fly out in all directions!



Terrariums

Terraria (single)

A glass container containing soil and plants that can be opened for maintenance to access the plants inside; however, terraria can also be open to the atmosphere.

Terraria are often kept as ornamental items.

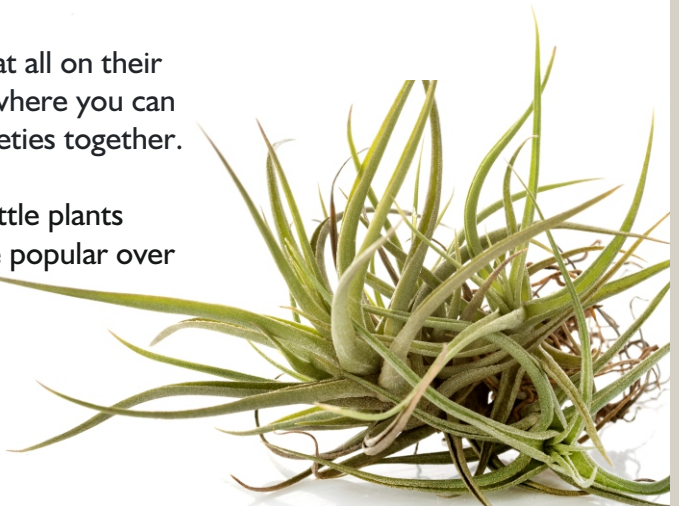
