Care & Handling

Longevity: In warmer climates (especially in India), the colourful leaves last from 4-6 weeks (November to February), then one has to 'house' the plant and wait for the leaves to turn colourful again the following year

Water requirements: Water as often as needed, but allow soil surface to dry before watering again be careful of standing water

Light: Plenty of bright light or leaves change colour to green

Soil/Nutrition requirements: Regular soil mix

Special care/remarks: Poinsettia plants like to be kept on the dry side
