The larger **Schefflera actinophylla** features long, shiny, oval green leaves that droop gracefully from a central stalk, resembling an umbrella

**Schefflera arboricola** (sometimes called dwarf Schefflera) features smaller, glossy leaves, sometimes with creamy variegation Other than the smaller size, it looks very similar to its taller cousin

## Care & Handling

Longevity: 10 years plus, although this depends on how well you care for it

Water requirements: It does not like wet feet, so water deeply and let dry almost completely between watering

**Light:** Place in a window with bright light or filtered indirect light

Nutrition requirements: Peaty well-drained soil mix

**Special care/remarks:** Clean leaves as needed with a damp sponge to maintain best foliage appearance

To increase humidity, mist foliage with water and/or place containers on a tray of wet pebbles

Prune to control size

All parts of the Schefflera plant are mildly toxic to humans and pets
