Longevity:

Water requirements: The Strelizia likes its soil moist, particularly in the warm months

Give it a drink whenever his top two inches of soil are dry

Light: Full sun to part shade. Does relatively well in areas with medium to bright light conditions, but it absolutely thrives in bright light conditions

Soil/Nutrition requirements: Prefers rich, moist soils with good drainage

Special care/remarks: It is often mislabeled and confused with the Strelitzia Reginae, a smaller type of Strelitzia, as they are both known as Bird of Paradise Plants due to their inflorescence resembling tropical birds
