There are about 80 species, and the genus is commonly cultivated for the marketplace

The plant

Origin; country or region: Vanda species are widespread across East Asia, Southeast Asia

Growth habit: Vanda can be found hanging from trees or from cracks in cliffs and other rocky locations. As an epiphyte, it is a plant which grows upon other plants but is not parasitic It obtains its moisture from air

Flower description: The genus is highly prized in horticulture for its showy, fragrant, long-lasting, and intensely colorful flowers Most show a yellow-brown color with brown markings, but they also appear in white, green, orange, red, and burgundy shades.

Blooming period/availability: Vanda species usually bloom every few months and the flowers last for two to three weeks

Leaf/Foliage Description: Some have flat, typically broad, ovoid leaves (strap-leaves), while others have cylindrical (terete), fleshy





Usage: The genus is highly prized in horticulture for its showy, fragrant, long-lasting, and intensely colorful flowers STRENGTHS/OPPORTUNITIES:

An exotic orchid variety, very unusual...

Used as showy hanging plants, in rock gardens or as cut flowers WEAKNESS:

Not easily available

Price is almost as much as the Phalaenopsis

Care & Handling

Longevity: Flowers last up to several weeks then fall off Blooms few times a year

Water requirements: If their situation is warm and sunny, they may need daily watering

Light: Is a crucial factor in blooming most orchid plants
Orchids prefer low light, warm temperatures, and high humidity **Soil/Nutrition requirements:** Mostly grown in slatted-wood baskets, or in pots with a coarse potting medium
Coco peat & orchid soil work best

Charcoal and pine wood are newer ways of growing Orchids

Special care/remarks: For Mumbai weather: mist twice a day daily in warm weather, once a day during cloudy weather
